# JOB DESCRIPTION

**Bus Maintainers – Group A,** under supervision, maintain, install, inspect, test, alter and repair the bodies and related mechanical, structural, and electrical equipment of buses and other automotive vehicles, including servicing, repairing and installing doors, seats, windows, framing, sheeting, hand bars, signs, floors, radiators, heat exchangers, bumpers, light fixtures and headlights; make and repair sheet metal or fiberglass body sections and structural members of buses using such tools and machines as are necessary; weld bus bodies and parts; disassemble bus bodies and parts using burning equipment; prepare vehicle bodies for painting; sand as necessary; spray and brush paint bus, truck and automobile bodies; manually and electronically document work activities; read and interpret technical documents, diagrams, and schematics; drive motor vehicles and operate machinery; and perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by Bus Maintainers – Group A and environmental conditions experienced are: crawling under buses and working in confined spaces; getting out of the way of moving buses and overhead cranes; distinguishing colors when mixing and matching paints; climbing and descending ladders; wearing goggles, gloves or respirators when required; using both hands to work overhead for extended periods of time; responding to audible signals such as alarms, bells, horns and whistles; responding to visual signals including distinguishing colored lights; and lifting and carrying heavy tools and equipment.

**Special Working Conditions**: Bus Maintainers – Group A may be required to work various shifts, including nights, Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

(This brief description does not include all of the duties of this position.)

#### SALARY

The current minimum salary for Bus Maintainer – Group A is \$35.90 per hour for a 40-hour work week increasing to \$42.24 per hour in the sixth year of service. These rates are subject to change.

## **ELIGIBILITY TO TAKE EXAMINATION**

This examination is open to each employee of MTA New York City Transit who **on the first date of the structured interview**:

- Is permanently (not provisionally) employed in or appears on a Preferred List (see Note, below) for the eligible title of Maintainer's Helper – Group B and is permanently employed in such title in the Department of Buses; and
- 2. Is not otherwise ineligible.

(Note: A "Preferred List" is a civil service list which is only for certain former permanent incumbents of the eligible title who have rehiring rights.)

This examination is also open to employees who were appointed to an eligible title pursuant to New York State Civil Service Law, section 55-a, and who meet all other eligibility requirements.

You are responsible for determining whether you meet the eligibility requirements for this examination prior to submitting the Application. If you do not know if you are eligible, check with **your department's Human Resources representative**. You may be given the test and/or assessment before we verify your eligibility. If you are marked "Not Eligible," your application fee will **not** be refunded, and you will **not** receive a score.

This examination is <u>not</u> open to employees of MaBSTOA or MTA Bus Company, or to employees of MTA agencies other than MTA New York City Transit.

# THE TEST

The test will consist of two distinct components: a <u>competitive</u> education and experience test, and a <u>qualifying</u> structured interview. A score of at least 65% is required to pass the <u>qualifying</u> structured interview.

You will be given a <u>competitive</u> education and experience exam. Your score on this <u>competitive</u> education and experience test will be used to determine 100% of your final score and your place on an eligible list. On the <u>competitive</u> education and experience test, you will receive a score of 70 points for meeting the eligibility requirements listed above. After these requirements are met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100 points on the following basis:

If you have satisfactory full-time experience with New York City Transit as a permanent (not provisional) employee performing or assisting with body work such as the maintenance, inspection, testing, alteration and repair of bodies and related mechanical, structural, and electrical equipment of buses and other automotive vehicles for:

You will receive up to:

At least 1 year but less than 2 years	6 points
At least 2 years but less than 3 years	12 points
At least 3 years but less than 4 years	18 points
At least 4 years but less than 5 years	24 points
5 or more years	30 points

If you have satisfactory full-time experience with an employer <u>other than New York City Transit</u>, performing body work such as the maintenance, inspection, testing, alteration and repair of bodies and related mechanical, structural, and electrical equipment of buses and other automotive vehicles for:

You will receive up to:

At least 1 years but less than 2 years	4 points
At least 2 years but less than 3 years	8 points
At least 3 years but less than 4 years	12 points
At least 4 years but less than 5 years	16 points
At least 5 years but less than 6 years	20 points
At least 6 years but less than 7 years	24 points
At least 7 years but less than 8 years	27 points
8 or more years	30 points

You will be scheduled to take the <u>qualifying</u> structured interview on a date indicated in the above "Test Date" box. You will be assigned to a test date and location, and you cannot request that your scheduled test date or location be changed, unless you meet the conditions in the "Special Test Accommodations" subsection below.

Veterans' or Disabled Veterans' Credit will be granted only to eligible passing candidates who request that they be applied. Veterans' or Disabled Veterans' Credit should be requested at the time of application but **must** be requested before the date the eligible list is established. Claims for Veterans' or Disabled Veterans' Credit cannot be made once the eligible list is established.

The <u>qualifying</u> structured interview may measure your knowledge, skills and abilities in the following and other related areas:

- **Body Work Repair:** The ability to maintain and repair bodies, undercarriages, and associated components of buses, automobiles, and trucks
  - o Example: Using the proper welding technique to weld a bus' frame
- Body Sheeting: The ability to perform body sheeting repair, preparation, and painting
  - o Example: Preparing a bus body for paint
- **Tool Usage:** Knowledge of hand tools, power tools and/or multi-purpose tools and their proper and safe usage in the electro-mechanical trade
  - o Example: Using a screwdriver to remove a screw
- **Schematics and Calculations:** Ability to read and interpret specifications and drawings; relevant mathematical calculations; and other related areas
  - o Example: Using a circuit schematic to trace the circuit you are working on

# **HOW TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION**

If you believe you meet the requirements in the "Eligibility to Take Examination" section, you may submit an application during the application period. If you believe you have a special circumstance (e.g., a disability, military duty) that prevents you from applying as instructed below, please refer to the Special Circumstances Guide referenced in the "Special Test Accommodations" subsection below. Applications will **not** be accepted in person.

# **Online Applications:**

- 1. If you are an active MTA employee, apply using the MTA Business Service Center (BSC) employee portal at <a href="www.mymta.info">www.mymta.info</a> by the last day of the application period (non-active MTA employees and applicants requesting a fee waiver must email us by the last day of the application period at <a href="mailto:examsunit@nyct.com">examsunit@nyct.com</a> for application instructions). <a href="Motor:Note">Note</a>: The application system may not function properly with mobile devices or tablets. For best results when applying, please use the latest version of Microsoft Edge, open a new window, and avoid having multiple tabs open in the same window.
- 2. Once you have logged in, click on the My Job Search ribbon and then click on Exams (non-Railroad).
- 3. Follow the steps to submit an application.
- 4. Active MTA employees must pay the application fee via payroll deduction.
- 5. A confirmation number will appear on the same page after submitting your application and authorizing a payroll deduction (Save this number for future reference).

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: Your application submission confirms that you have read this Notice of Examination, including any dates and the requirements.

**Application Fee**: This fee is generally not refundable. Under special circumstances, you may be entitled to a refund. Please refer to the Department of Citywide Administrative Services ("DCAS") General Exam Regulation E.3.4 to determine if you are entitled to a refund. If you submit an application for this promotion examination and you also submit an application for the open competitive examination for Bus Maintainer - Group A, Exam No. 5600, you will only be permitted to take the test(s) for this title one time.

**Late Applications**: Refer to the "Correspondence" section below to contact the Examinations Unit to determine the procedure for submitting a late application if you meet one of the following conditions:

- 1. You are absent from work for at least one-half of the application period and are unable to apply for reasons such as vacation, sick leave or military duty; or
- 2. You become eligible after the above application period, but before the first test date.

**Special Test Accommodations:** If you plan to request an alternate test date due to your religious observance or special testing accommodations due to disability, please follow the instructions included in the Special Circumstances Guide, which is accessible online at <a href="http://web.mta.info/nyct/hr/forms\_instructions.htm">http://web.mta.info/nyct/hr/forms\_instructions.htm</a> and will be attached to this Notice of Examination during the application period. An alternate test date due to religious observance must be requested no later than 15 days prior to the date on which the structured interviews are expected to begin. Special testing accommodations due to disability must be requested no later than 30 days prior to the date on which the structured interviews are expected to begin.

**Make-Up Tests:** You may apply for a make-up test if you cannot take the structured interview as scheduled for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Compulsory attendance before a public body; or
- 2. On-the-job injury or illness caused by municipal employment where you are an officer or employee of the City; or

- 3. Absence from the test within one week after the death of a spouse, domestic partner, parent, parent-in-law, sibling, child, or child of a domestic partner where you are an officer or employee of the City; or
- 4. Absence due to ordered military duty; or
- 5. A clear error for which MTA New York City Transit is responsible; or
- 6. A temporary disability; or
- 7. Pregnancy, childbirth or a related medical condition.

# CORRESPONDENCE

Change of Contact Information: It is critical that you keep your contact information (i.e., telephone number, mailing address and/or email address) current with MTA New York City Transit. You may miss important information about your exam(s) or consideration for appointment or promotion, including important information that may require a response from you by a specified deadline, if we do not have your correct contact information. ### TEST SITE REQUIREMENTS

An Admission Letter will be mailed to you about 10 days before the first date of the structured interviews. If you do not receive an Admission Letter at least 4 days before this date, you must email a request for a duplicate Admission Letter to <a href="mailto:examsunit@nyct.com">examsunit@nyct.com</a>. A paper copy of the Admission Letter is your ticket for admission to the test.

Applicants **must** keep their mailing address **up to date**. Please refer to the "Correspondence" section above for instructions on how to update your address and other contact information.

**Warning:** You are not permitted to enter the test site with cellular phones, smart watches, beepers, pagers, cameras, portable media players, or other electronic devices. Calculators are permitted; however, they must be hand-held, battery or solar powered, numeric only. Calculators with functions **other than** addition, subtraction, multiplication and division **are prohibited**. Electronic devices with an alphabetic keyboard or with word processing or data recording capabilities such as planners, organizers, etc. are prohibited. If you use any of these devices in the building at any time before, during

or after the test, you may <u>not</u> receive your test results, your test score may be nullified, and your application fee will <u>not</u> be refunded.

You may not have any other person, including children, present with you while you are being processed for or taking the test and no one may wait for you inside of the test site while you are taking the test.

You are also not permitted to use on site any medical assistive devices, including those that give notifications or alerts, or that vibrate, without the prior express written authorization of MTA New York City Transit. You can contact MTA New York City Transit by email at: examsmakeups@nyct.com.

**Leaving:** You must leave the test site once you finish the test. If you leave the test site after being fingerprinted but before finishing the test, you will not be permitted to re-enter. If you disregard this instruction and re-enter the test site, you may not receive your test results, your test score may be nullified, and your application fee will not be refunded.

**Proof of Identity:** You must present your MTA New York City Transit employee ID when you arrive to take the test.

### THE TEST RESULTS

If you pass the <u>competitive</u> education and experience test and the <u>qualifying</u> structured interview and are marked eligible, your name will be placed in final score order on an eligible list and you will be given a list number. You will be notified by mail of your test results. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for promotion when your name is reached on the eligible list.

# REQUIREMENTS TO BE PROMOTED

**Probationary Period:** At the time of promotion, you must have completed your probationary period in the eligible title as indicated in the above "Eligibility to Take Examination" section, and you must be permanently employed in that title or your name must appear on a Preferred List for the title at the time of promotion. Additionally, you must have served permanently in the eligible title for at least one year. Time served prior to a break in service of more than one year will not be credited.

**Driver License Requirement:** At the time of promotion, you must possess a Motor Vehicle Driver License valid in the State of New York.

Within 14 days of promotion, you must obtain a Learner Permit for a Class B Commercial Driver License (CDL) valid in the State of New York with a passenger endorsement and no airbrake restrictions, or any other disqualifying restrictions. Additionally, a Class B CDL valid in the State of New York with a passenger endorsement, no airbrake restrictions, and no other disqualifying restrictions must be obtained within 120 days of promotion. Failure to do so may result in termination or a return to your previously held permanent title. If you have serious moving violations, a license suspension, or an accident record, you may be disqualified.

The Class A or Class B CDL with a passenger endorsement, no airbrake restrictions and no other disqualifying restrictions must be maintained for the duration of your employment in the title. Such license must not include any restrictions which would preclude the performance of Bus Maintainer – Group A work.

Commercial Motor Vehicle Driving Experience in the Military or New York National Guard: If you are an active member or former member (discharged in the past year) of the military or New York National Guard and have experience driving a Commercial Motor Vehicle in the military or New York National Guard, you may be eligible for a waiver of the New York State commercial driving skills test through the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. If you believe that you may be eligible for this waiver, you must apply for the waiver through the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles.

**Medical Requirement:** Medical guidelines have been established for the position of Bus Maintainer – Group A. Candidates will be examined to determine whether they can perform the essential functions of the position. Where appropriate, a reasonable accommodation will be provided for a person with a disability to enable such person to perform the essential functions of the job.

**Drug Screening Requirement:** You must pass a drug screening in order to be promoted, and if promoted, you will be subject to random drug and alcohol tests for the duration of your employment. Additionally, if you have tested positive on a drug or alcohol test or had a refusal to test during preemployment or while employed by a Federal DOT-regulated employer during the applicable period, you must have completed the Substance Abuse Professional (SAP) evaluation, referral and education/treatment process required by federal law in order to be promoted to this safety-sensitive position.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

**Training:** You may be required to undergo a formalized training course during your probationary period. Failure to successfully complete the training course may result in termination or being returned to your previously held permanent title.

**Probationary Period:** You will be required to complete a probationary period. If you do not successfully complete the probationary period, you may be terminated or returned to your previously held permanent title.

### PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION

Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after promotion, and may result in criminal prosecution.
