PROTECTIVE MEASURES

The Second Avenue Subway alignment and stations have been planned to avoid construction beneath existing buildings and structures wherever possible.

SAFETY TESTING

After the subway station and tunnel construction is completed, New York City Transit will test all of the components and systems that allow the stations to operate.
