New Schedules Effective April 2

When developing our **new timetables**, which go into effect **Sunday**, **April 2**, we wanted to make small adjustments to improve our performance in peak periods while continuing to accommodate essential track outages for crucial infrastructure work. (See "We're Making Tracks" in this issue.)

Major changes to look for by line include:

On the Hudson Line:

Weekday reverse peak busing between Philipse Manor and Scarborough stations to support Sandy-related fix and fortify work will now continue until Monday, May

1. On that date, train service to those stations will resume. Thank you for your patience during those infrastructure improvements!

On the Harlem Line:

Look for a new weekend express train departing Grand Central at 6:50 AM, serving Valhalla to Southeast. (The 6:24 AM train from Grand Central will now operate to North White Plains as a result of this addition.)

Also, on weekdays, the 1:15 AM train from Grand Central to North White Plans will depart five minutes later at 1:20 AM.



Minor schedule adjustments will see 2 minutes added to most inbound trains' running times to accommodate infrastructure improvements being made from Stamford to just east of Harrison Station. See a new timetable for changes.

Also, on the Waterbury Branch:

Look for minor adjustments to the first two inbound AM peak trains, which depart four minutes earlier at 5:40 AM and 6:38 AM.

Be sure to pick up a new timetable in Grand Central and at outlying stations to check for possible adjustments to your train's schedule. Schedules are also available **online** or on your tablet or smartphone via **our free Train Time App**.

Reminder: New Fares Effective March 19 in New York State

New fares will go into effect on the Harlem and Hudson Lines, as well as on the New Haven Line for travel between stations in New York State ONLY, on Sunday, March 19, 2017.

• For monthly and weekly commuters, fares will increase by no more than 3.75%. Monthly ticket increases will not exceed \$15.00.



- Intermediate monthly and weekly ticket increases are also capped at 3.75%. Some one-way fares will have larger increases only because fares must occur in 25¢ increments. For these one-way fares, any increase greater than 6% would not be more than 50¢ per ride.
- Monthly/Weekly UniTicket Fares will increase by approximately 4%.
- The cost of Family Fare tickets and City Tickets remains unchanged.

The MTA's continued discipline in keeping costs down has resulted in the lowest increase since 2009, when the MTA committed to a biennial schedule to keep adjustments as small and predictable as possible.

PLEASE NOTE: The March 19 fare increase does not affect ticket prices for travel between stations in Connecticut and New York, or between stations within Connecticut.



We're Making Tracks!

As you probably have noticed, our program of aggressive infrastructure improvements continues, setting the foundation for delivering safe, reliable and smooth service to you! (We alluded to it in the last issue of Mileposts.)

Since 2013, we've:

- Replaced 149,044 ties,
- Laid 26.5 miles of continuous welded rail,
- · Rebuilt 148 switches,
- Renewed and/or upgraded 60 railroad crossings (45% of all the crossings on our territory) and.
- Performed 4,835 welds on joints that connect rails with one another.



Normally, such extensive track work brings an increased probability of train delays. But we've been able to adjust train schedules to accommodate off-peak and weekend track outages. (See the previous story.) This allows us to perform critical maintenance and capital construction projects with little impact on your travels.

In 2016, Metro-North crews made particularly strong strides forward in the Railroad's field welding program. Last year, crews completed over 1,900 welds, a jump of almost one third from 2015. Each weld removes one joint in the rail; this not only provides you with a smoother ride, but also eliminates a possible failure spot and potential service disruptions.

Our crews also accomplished an extraordinary amount of repair work on railroad bridges, installing new timber decks and making steel repairs, as well as upgrading overhead highway bridges that we maintain which carry local roads over our tracks.

Track inspections are another massive undertaking. In addition to visual track inspections, which are conducted twice a week, we use a myriad of sophisticated equipment that can detect issues unseen by the human eye.

High-tech inspections look at:



Track Geometry

To measure the position, curvature, alignment, smoothness, and the cross level of the two running rails, (parallel track) track geometry cars operated by the Federal Railroad Administration and Mermec (a company that provides track geometry assessments) are employed. The cars use a variety of sensors, measuring systems, and data management systems to create a profile of the track being inspected.

Internal Metal Defects and Fatigue

To detect flaws, defects and metal fatigue inside our track's steel rails, Sperry Rail Service operates a specialized car over the rails, inspecting them with ultrasonic and induction test equipment.



Mismatched Joint Bars

To identify any instances where the end of a rail does not match up precisely with the beginning of the following rail, Georgetown Rail Equipment Company's Aurora System patrols our territory, taking measurements of rail joint bars that are accurate to within two-hundredths





A track loading vehicle is used to give rails a stress test, applying forces close to the strength limits of the rails, track ties, rail fasteners, and stone ballast.

In addition to all of the above:

We have purchased and installed Automated

Geometry Inspection Equipment on three of our revenue train cars, which will allow continuous track geometry measurements to be made as they travel around the system. This equipment is in test mode, and is expected to be fully functional later this year.

Track Loading

Finally, we are purchasing a state-of-the-art self-propelled track geometry car

that will use innovative laser, optical and inertial sensor systems to analyze the condition of the rail and track infrastructure, alerting us to any track anomalies. The inspection vehicle will undergo a period of calibration and testing before it's entered into service in early 2018.

In the next issue of Mileposts, we will provide you with an overview of the extensive track work we have planned starting in the spring.

Also, monthly and weekly ticket holders who normally travel to or from Manhattan (on any of the three lines) can travel to or from Yankees - E. 153rd Street Station at no extra charge!

Metro-North & Zipcar: Ride2Drive

Now we take you to where the "rubber meets the road!"



Thanks to a new partnership recently announced by Governor Andrew Cuomo between **Metro-North and Zipcar**, you've got more convenient access to a set of wheels at nine of our stations in the Hudson Valley!

A total of 14 Zipcars are available now through the partnership including a Honda Civic, a Jeep Renegade and a Honda CR-V. The vehicles are parked at dedicated, clearly marked spaces at station lots, providing you with the ease and simplicity of stepping off the train, hopping into a Zipcar and conveniently continuing on to destinations beyond the station.

Zipcars can now be found at the following stations:

On the Hudson Line:

• Poughkeepsie • Beacon

On the Harlem Line:

• North White Plains • Woodlawn

On the New Haven Line:

• Port Chester • Harrison • Mamaroneck • Pelham • Mount Vernon East

The availability of Zipcars at these stations is part of our new **Ride2Drive** program, which aims to encourage visitors to travel to the Hudson Valley and at the same time increase mobility to New Yorkers who don't own cars. Within the next year, the program is **expected to expand to an additional 24 of our train stations** in New York State, both east and west of the Hudson River.

In addition to our select Metro-North stations, Zipcar provides access to thousands of vehicles in greater New York for reservation by the hour or day. Prospective members can join the service instantly though the Zipcar mobile app for iPhone/iPad or Android devices or online.
