We start things off with our Early Christmas Getaway Service on Friday, December 22. See Weekday Schedule

It features extra trains departing Grand Central beginning at 1 PM. Some evening trains will be cancelled or combined because of reduced ridership later in the day. (Hopefully, you don't work for a Scrooge and they let you go home early!)

On Christmas Eve which falls on Sunday, December 24, See Weekend Schedule

and we will operate a regular Sunday schedule, with additional Shoppers Specials. (*Tip for a Merry Christmas: We recommend you do all your shopping before then...*)

On Christmas Day, Monday, December 25, See Holiday Schedule

we will operate a special holiday schedule with hourly service on most line segments, and regular weekend service on all branch lines.

For the week between Christmas and New Year's (Tuesday – Thursday, December 26 – 28),

See Weekday Schedule

we will operate a weekday schedule with reduced AM Peak service and additional inbound service operating in the late morning. PM peak service will operate normally.

So if you are taking family and friends to see the tree at Rockefeller Center, planning to stroll by the holiday window displays along Fifth Avenue, or just re-gifting that knitted bearded beanie Mom got you (yes, it really exists) we will be able to get you there.

We suggest purchasing an off-peak ten-trip ticket. In addition to the discounted price, it is transferable, so everyone riding with you can use it. (It is like the gift that keeps on giving!)

And we recommend you use **MTA** eTix[®], the mobile ticketing app that enables you to purchase those ten-trip, one way, round trip, weekly and monthly passes on your smartphone or mobile device.

On Friday, December 29,

we will operate reduced weekday AM Peak service with additional inbound trains in the late morning.

In the afternoon, look for our early getaway service (same as Friday, December 22.)

On New Year's Eve, Sunday, December 31,

See Holiday Schedule

Whether you are putting on your top hat, tails, or evening gown (or all three) for a sophisticated evening out, or just throwing on some sweat pants and a parka and heading to Times Square to watch the ball drop, our New Year's Eve Service on Sunday, December 31, is for you!

It includes extra inbound late afternoon and early evening service to get you to your party. And there is "overnight" New Year's morning service that will get you safely home when that party is finally over!

Please remember that drinking alcohol on Metro-North trains and at our stations is banned from noon New Year's Eve until noon New Year's Day. (Because there comes a time when the party really is over.)

Your first resolution for the New Year should be to buy your tickets in advance:

Those of you taking our early morning New Year service will have your tickets collected prior to boarding trains at Grand Central.

Again, start the New Year off right and resolve to use MTA eTix®.

Finally, on New Year's Day, Monday, January 1, 2018, See Weekend Schedule we will operate hourly service on most line segments, and regular weekend service on branch lines.

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Connecticut's New Haven Line Fare Increase Effective January 1, 2018

A Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) fare increase of 1% goes into effect for stations on the Connecticut portion of the New Haven Line on January 1, 2018.

This is the last of seven consecutive annual fare increases that were previously authorized to fund the purchase of M8 rail cars.



The changes will affect ticket prices for travel:

- · Between stations within Connecticut;
- Between stations in Connecticut and New York stations.

The fare increase does not affect travel to/from stations within New York State.

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You Don't Have to Worry About the Grinch Stealing Christmas

He isn't real! (Unlike Santa...)

It's all those other bad characters who believe "it is better to take than to give" that you have to be wary of this holiday season.

That is why we recommend you take the following precautions while traveling:

- Keep your property in sight at all times. Never put anything of value in the overhead racks of our trains.
- Make sure your handbag closes tightly and carry it close to your body at all times.
- Carry your wallet in your inside coat pocket, or better still, your side pants pocket. (We'd like to see somebody try and get in there!)
- At cash machines and ticket vending machines, make sure no one is looking over your shoulder to get your bank card or Personal Identification Number (PIN).
- Never leave your packages unattended.
 Unattended packages are subject to search by MTA Police. This often results in delays for fellow commuters (and an embarrassing situation for you).
- Finally, if you see something, say something. During the holidays, it is especially important that you remain vigilant. As always, you should inform a police officer or MTA employee if you see anything unusual, or call 888-NYC-SAFE (888-692-7233).
