Metro-North's convenient Thanksgiving holiday service will make you give thanks for avoiding traffic, tolls, and all the other headaches that come with driving on one of the busiest travel days of the year.

We'll be publishing a special Thanksgiving Holiday Timetable covering Thursday, November 24 – Sunday, November 27. So be sure to pick one up in Grand Central or at our outlying stations. You can also find train times on our schedules page at or by using our Train Time App on your iPhone or Android!



On Wednesday, November 23:

Take flight on one of our early getaway trains, which begin departing Grand Central at around 1 PM. See a regular timetable for details. Because of reduced ridership, some evening trains may be cancelled or combined.

On Thanksgiving (Thursday, November 24),

we will operate a weekend schedule with additional inbound trains for those of you heading to the Macy's Thanksgiving Holiday Parade. (Nothing works up an appetite like watching a giant, gas-filled Pikachu parading down Sixth Avenue...)

And we will have plenty of additional outbound service to get you home to the dinner table (or to wherever you choose to feast).



On the Day after Thanksgiving (Friday, November 25),

we will operate a **Saturday schedule with additional trains** inbound in the AM and outbound in the PM so you can take advantage of all those Black Friday sales. (Although all the best bargains may have been snapped up by those consumers who went shopping on Thanksgiving Day!)

Finally, on Saturday, November 26 and Sunday, November 27:

we will provide regular weekend schedules with additional Shoppers' Specials trains. (And, see this story.)

Off-peak fares are in effect for the entire four-day holiday,

and you can take advantage of **free parking** at many of our **stations**. (Check for signs at stations, or call 511 for details. Outside of New York, call 877-690-5114.)

If you are traveling to/from Manhattan with family and friends to see the holiday sights, why not purchase a ten-trip, off-peak ticket and save 30-40% off the one-way fare. The ticket can be used by more than one person, even when you are traveling together. Or use our Family Fare and pay \$1 per ticket for up to four children (ages 5-11) when they are traveling with a fare-paying adult. (The fifth child and all other children pay the Child Fare).

Finally, here's our recipe for happy Thanksgiving travel:

Buy your tickets in advance (like your turkey). Thanksgiving is the busiest travel day of the year, and if you're leaving New York after the parade, you must have your ticket before boarding your train at Grand Central or Harlem-125th Street Station.

We recommend you use MTA eTix®, the mobile ticketing app that enables you to purchase one way, round trip, ten trip, weekly and monthly passes on your Android, iPhone or iPad.

Remember, please purchase your ticket BEFORE boarding the train!

(Also, be sure to scarf down a huge piece of pumpkin pie before embarking on your travels.)

Connecticut's New Haven Line Fare Increase Effective December 1, 2016

A Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) fare increase of 6% goes into effect on the Connecticut portion of the New Haven Line on December 1, 2016.

This increase will affect ticket prices for travel:

- · Between stations within Connecticut
- · Between stations in Connecticut and New York stations

The fare increase does not affect travel to/from stations within New York State.

Please note: WebTicket sales will no longer be available as of December 1st, 2016.


