OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Unaccompanied Children: MTA Metro-North Railroad recommends that children under the age of 8 be accompanied by an adult or a responsible youth (at least 12 years old) when riding its trains. Children age 8 and above may ride alone, but we strongly suggest that they carry identification showing their name, address, home phone number and the name and phone number of the person who will be meeting them. Children's Fares and Family Fare - Children 5-11 years old ride for 50% of adult fares; children under 5 years old ride free at all times. 'Family Fare' is available for off-peak travel; up to four children 5-11 may ride for \$1.00 when accompanied by a fare-paying adult 18 years or older. TICKETS, FARES & PURCHASING OPTIONS

MTA eTix® Buy your monthly, weekly, ten-trip, one-way, round trip and CityTickets directly from your mobile device using MTA eTix. Download the free App, create your account and enter your credit/debit card information. Don't forget to activate the ticket just before boarding!

At Stations Buy any ticket at a ticket office or easy-to-use ticket machine. You can use cash or a major credit or debit card. In the event of a ticket vending machine malfunction, please call our toll-free hotline at 877-886-6677.

On Board the Train Purchasing your ticket on board the train is the most expensive ticket-buying option, costing between \$5.75 and \$6.50 more than the regular ticket price. Multiple payment options can be used, including cash, credit cards, pinless debit cards, and Transit Benefit cards. Train crews must charge the higher on-board fare at all times without exceptions. Train crews have no discretion to waive the rule, even if there is no ticket office or working ticket machine at your boarding station.

Ticket Types

One-Way - Good for one ride for 60 days including date of sale. Sold for: Peak - Weekday trains in the gray shaded areas in this timetable. Off Peak - All other trains including all day weekends & holidays.

Round-Trip - Good for two rides for 60 days including date of sale. Sold for peak or off-peak travel. Priced at the combination of one way fares selected (peak, off-peak, peak/off-peak, senior both ways, etc.).

Weekly - Unlimited rides Saturday through Friday. On sale the Wednesday before the Saturday that the ticket becomes valid. Non-transferable.

Monthly - Unlimited rides during the calendar month indicated on the ticket. On sale starting on the 20th of the month prior. Non-transferable.

Ten-Trip Tickets - Good for ten one-way rides. Valid for six months from date of sale. Can be shared. Sold for peak, off-peak, or intermediate travel. We also sell Senior/People with Disabilities and Medicare Customers Ten-Trips.

20-Trip Tickets - Promotional fare, good for 20 Peak one-way rides. Valid for 60 days from date of sale. Available only through eTix app and at ticket offices. Promotion subject to change, please visit MTA.info for details.

Senior/People with Disabilities and Medicare Customers Half-fare good at all times except weekday AM Peak trains. Seniors must be 65 or older with valid ID; people with disabilities must present MTA ID card. Medicare customers must present valid Medicare card or an MTA Reduced-Fare MetroCard at time of ticket purchase or use to obtain half-fare price. Valid for 60 Days including date of sale.

Children's Fares and Family Fare - Children 5-11 years old ride for 50% of adult fares; children under 5 years old ride free at all times. 'Family Fare' is available for off-peak travel; up to four children 5-11 may ride for \$1.00 when accompanied by a fare-paying adult 18 years or older. Valid for 60 Days including date of sale.
