

# Fixing the Rutgers Tunnel

## Tunnel work will change **E** **F** routes in Queens, Manhattan and Brooklyn

### What's happening?

Superstorm Sandy caused severe damage to 11 of our underwater tunnels, including the Rutgers Tunnel that carries **F** trains between Manhattan and Brooklyn. We've made temporary fixes since 2012, but now need to fully rehabilitate the tunnel.

### Where will service run?

#### Between Queens and Manhattan:

**E** trains will be rerouted via **F** in both directions between **21 St-Queensbridge** and **Delancey St-Essex St**, the last stop. Trains will run via 6 Av in Manhattan.

**F** trains will be rerouted via **E** in both directions between **Queens Plaza** and **W 4 St**. Trains will run via 8 Av in Manhattan.

#### Between Manhattan and Brooklyn:

**F** trains will be rerouted via **A** in both directions between **W 4 St** and **Jay St-MetroTech**.

**East Broadway** and **York St** will be closed after 9:45 PM each night during the week, and all weekend.

### What are the best travel alternatives?

**E** trains will serve **F** stations between **21 St-Queensbridge** and **Delancey St-Essex St**, the last stop.

**F** trains will serve **E** stations between **Queens Plaza** and **Chambers St-World Trade Center**.

**A** **C** and rerouted **F** trains will serve **E** stations between **42 St-Port Authority** and **Chambers St-World Trade Center**.

**R** trains will serve **World Trade Center-Cortlandt St**.

Free shuttle buses will connect **East Broadway** with **Delancey St-Essex St** **E** **J** in Manhattan.

Free shuttle buses will connect **Jay St-MetroTech** with **York St** in Brooklyn.

- 34 St-Herald Sq: **E** **N** **Q** **R**
- W 4 St: **A** **C** **D** **E** **F**
- Fulton St: **A** **C** **F** **J**
